OTHER NOTABLE FACTS

- Former Head Football Coach and Girls Varsity Softball Coach, Steve Miner, who helped revitalize Madison's football program starting in 2000 through 2003, was inducted into the San Diego County High School Coaching Legends Hall of Fame in November 2008.
- Extensive use of instructional technology, including recent installation of Promethean Interactive Whiteboards in all mathematics, social studies and English classrooms.
- Five major student recognition events annually to acknowledge excellence, including 2 Principal's Honor Roll Assemblies, Smart Cookies (achievement in college-bound tests), Underclassman Awards, and Senior Awards.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

- **Gifted and Talented Education Program (GATE) Cluster** offers qualitatively different instruction in math, science, humanities, and world languages to gifted and talented students.
- **GATE Seminar** program for highly gifted students; enrollment is limited to 50 students in grades 9 and 10 selected on the basis of test scores, achievement, teacher recommendation, and student application.
- **Advanced Placement (AP) & College** courses offered in Spanish Language, English Language/Literature, Biology, US History, World History, Psychology, US Government, Calculus, and Statistics. Political Science 101-102 (in partnership with Mesa Community College.)
- **Army Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps (AJROTC)** is an elective program emphasizing the study and development of leadership, citizenship, patriotism, military science and service.
- **Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID)** program prepares ethnically underrepresented and/or economically disadvantaged students with academic potential for college, grades 9-12.
- **English Learners (EL) Program** is designed for students who have limited English skills through English as a Second Language classes.
- **Specialized Academic Instruction (SAI)** assists students with an active Individualized Education Plan (IEP); an **Integrated Life Skills Program (ILS)** assists students with severe and/or multiple handicaps.
- **Deaf and Hard of Hearing Program (D/HH)** provides self-contained classrooms taught in sign language and/or orally, with itinerant, speech, audiological, interpreting, transcribing, counseling, and note-taking services (Madison is the only high school to provide all of these services in the San Diego Unified School District and San Diego County.)
